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Dilation Informed Consent

Early or advanced signs of many internal eye diseases can be present at any age. The purpose of pupil dilation is to detect early or late signs of internal eye disease and in rare cases to aid in determining a proper prescription. We find internal eye disease in people who have good vision and presumably no problems with their eyes, whatsoever, as often as we detect internal eye disease in those who *are* experiencing difficulties with their eyes or vision.

If an eye dilation is not performed then we are not providing a comprehensive eye examination.

Side effects of an eye dilation include but not limited to light sensitivity and blurred vision. Most people can drive just fine after having their eyes dilated if they have glasses with sunshades or sunglasses. We have disposable sunglasses to minimize the light sensitivity after the exam if your child does not have any. The doctor will let you know if rescheduling the dilation would be best on account of blurred vision.
